A Note from our Headmaster



Dear Argonaut Families,

I vividly remember coming around the corner in my house and seeing my dining room wall with crayons scribbled up and down a three-footspace. With heat rushing to my face and not thinking clearly, I asked my son (three years old at the time), who held a crayon in

his hand, "Did you do this!" I felt punched in the stomach when he said, "No, mommy, I didn't do that." While I was shocked by his reply, given the evidence was still in his hand, that my son could flat-out lie to me, I knew it was part of children's cognitive development. Even though, it was up to me as his parent to teach him why honesty is part of being virtuous.

Honesty has two components, being honest with oneself and being honest with others. If I am honest with myself about my strengths and weaknesses, I can face adverse circumstances better than if I am deceiving myself. Thinking that I am strong in some area when I am not will not serve me well when adversity comes along and exposes my weakness. A second way honesty can help us live a virtuous life is by being honest with others. Having the courage to not look past their problems but honestly confront and address them promotes trust, fosters healthy relationships, strengthens organizations and societies, and prevents harm.

I am challenging the staff to be honest this year, holding others accountable to expectations in love for the sake of the culture. Confrontation is hard, and most children, let alone adults, are not trained to have a critical conversation and do it well. Most people are afraid of the consequences of honesty, and from this fear comes more and more falsehood. Of course, when someone is struggling, tact and discretion are needed to avoid making the situation worse, even if everything we say is the truth.

There are different ways of getting across the same truth and blunt honesty, devoid of other virtues like compassion and tactfulness, may not be the best way. With this in mind, we can cultivate honesty with our scholars by walking the talk. If you are always going on about the importance of honesty, but your children overhear you lying to get an underage price ticket into the zoo, they will pick up on the hypocrisy. Our actions speak louder than words. We can also talk about honesty by

giving our scholars hypotheticals involving the temptation to lie. Another way to discuss honesty is to read or watch movies together that grapple with honesty. Last, acknowledge and recognize honest behavior in your scholar. Researchers point out positive feedback is more effective than negative feedback to inculcate good habits. In order to be a virtuous person, it is not enough just to act well. One's heart behind the action matters too. Honesty is no exception. Telling the truth, even if one is reliable in doing so, won't be an expression of the virtue of honesty if it is done just to make a good impression on others or to avoid getting punished

31st Street Storm Drain, Pavement, and Pedestrian Improvements: Thunderbird Road to Hearn Road

Construction Notice

February 2023

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The City of Phoenix Street Transportation Department has contracted with Hunter Contracting Co. to construct sidewalk and driveway improvements, new storm drain pipe and associated catch basins, relocate an existing water line and install a new portion of water line and pavement replacement in 31st Street from Thunderbird Road to Hearn Road.

What to Expect:

- Construction will begin Tuesday, March 7, 2023.
- Contractor's work hours will generally be Monday -Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (winter hours) and 6:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (summer hours). Some night work may be required.
- ROAD CLOSURE: 31st Street will be closed from Thunderbird Road to south of Hearn Road for approximately 6 months. Local access will be maintained for access to Friess Road and the Century Link parking lot.
- Pedestrian access will be maintained with a 36-inch accessible path on all pedestrian walkways.
- Beginning in mid-May 2023, Village Square Apartments north side parking lot access and parking will be restricted in phases during the storm drain pipe and catch basin installation. Apartment management and residents will be notified prior to any restrictions.
- Water service interruptions will occur; however, residents and business will be notified prior to any scheduled water service interruptions.
- Anticipated project completion is December 31, 2023.
